Further to my letter on Friday, I just wanted to confirm the following work that should be accessed weekly at home:

### Years 1 to 6:

- Each class will have a maths video uploaded to the Teams remote learning platform each Friday. This video will support and remind children about the maths topic they are about to start and can be used throughout the week as a reminder of the work they have completed in school. The plan is for the children to watch and talk through their learning and understanding. There will be a unit maths assessment for each new maths unit uploaded to Teams. This assessment will give example questions for the maths topic being learnt at school. Again, please ask your child to work through these questions, as this will help prepare them for the end of unit assessment at school.
- Times Tables Rock Stars is available for all children in years 2 – 6 to practise their times table knowledge. This can be accessed online.
- Children in Years 1 to 6 have their weekly spelling lists on Spellingframe and every child should practise these words throughout the week. Children should copy the words out and write them in sentences to show understanding of their meaning.
- All children, whether a Read Write Inc. phonics book or Accelerated Reader book, should read daily at home and we ask that they read at least five times a week to support fluency and development of reading. Please also remember to access the online chapters read by staff on Assemblies, Teams or the reading on the school website.

Although we cannot accept homework printed and brought into school, it is very important that we encourage all our children to continue their learning out of school as well as in school.

### Reception children:

- Children should continue to be read to at home: we hope the weekly pictures are useful for this. Also, all Reception children should bring home their Read Write Inc. phonics book to share and some groups will now start to bring home a weekly RWI bookbag book too. These books should become familiar to the children to support their reading: repetition and really getting to know a text builds confidence in reading 😊.

Throughout the day at school, children will have learning in their class or as part of a small group or intervention. Today, we also started some maths intervention work in small groups too. I hope the children enjoy talking about their learning each day when they get home.

It would be useful to have feedback on how well your child accesses these resources. If your child cannot remember their password onto any online resources or their class learning platform on Teams please let us know. We are really working hard at school to cover learning that might have been missed due to the pandemic. We really appreciate your support with this. Thank you.
