<p>Gathering of KS2 children and staff with parents in the Church to watch the KS2 Carols.</p>	<p>Follow: https://assets.publishing.service.gov.uk/government/uploads/system/uploads/attachment_data/file/1036663/Schools_guidance_update_for_Omicron_-_29_Nov.pdf DfE Control measures: • Follow Schools covid-19 operational guidance.</p> <p>If any part of our school is in remote learning we will be told by Public Health that all events on-site will need to be cancelled.</p> <p>Visitors should only attend the KS2 performance if they are well and not showing any of the Covid-19 symptoms:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a high temperature • a new, continuous cough • a loss of, or change to, your sense of smell or taste • All staff/pupils/visitors are advised to take a PCR and isolate until results are confirmed. As with positive cases in any other setting NHS Track & Trace will work the positive case and or their parent to identify close contacts. 	<p><u>Beforehand:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Each KS2 child is allowed up to two audience members (two adults or one adult and one pre-school child; babies swaddled to an adult are permitted and not counted). No children from other schools may attend. • All adult visitors need to have completed a LFD within the preceding 24 hours of the performance and submit photographic evidence to the office <u>between 12 noon and 7 pm, on the previous day.</u> This is a requirement of entry into the performance. • All children and members of the audience to have washed their hands before coming to church. • On entering the church, all KS2 children, staff and audience members will use hand sanitiser. • No adult/child will be allowed to enter if they are displaying Covid-19 symptoms. • All audience will sit in their first choice of seat and move to the end of the pew to reduce the risk of moving past each other too closely. • All audience will wear a face mask throughout the concert and time in the church. • Seat signs in operation: green signs show spaces, red signs indicate spaces not to be sat at. <p><u>Arrival: 9am Performance: Y5</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All children are to come to school through the front gate at 8.30 am. • Audience to arrive no earlier than 8.50 am outside of church. • Adults are asked to wait away from the church and are advised to avoid congregating in groups whilst waiting to enter. All audience will be sat before the children enter church. • At the end of the concert, the children will leave first. The audience will remain seated until the children have crossed the road and are heading back to school. • The parents and carers will be asked to leave the church and move away. The pews will then be cleaned before the next performance. <p><u>Arrival: 10am Performance: Y4 and Y6</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Visitors are asked to arrive at the church no earlier than 9:50am and are asked to wait away from the church door/path whilst the KS2 children/staff are entering, and are advised to avoid congregating in groups. • Once the church is cleaned, the adults will be allowed to enter and take their seats. • All adults are to sit in their first choice of seat.

- At the end of the concert, the children will leave first. The audience will remain seated until the children have crossed the road and are heading back to school.
- The parents and carers will be asked to leave the church and move away. The pews will then be cleaned before the next concert.

Arrival: 11am Performance: Y3

- Visitors are asked to arrive at the church no earlier than 10:50am and are asked to wait away from the church door/path whilst the KS2 children/staff are entering, and are advised to avoid congregating in groups.
- Once the church is cleaned, the adults will be allowed to enter and take their seats.
- All adults are to sit in their first choice of seat.
- At the end of the concert, the children will leave first. The audience will remain seated until the children have crossed the road and are heading back to school.
- The parents and carers will be asked to leave the church and move away. The pews will then be cleaned.

During:

- Performances have been planned so that each performance has children from only one or two, year groups.
- Each year group will be sat apart.
- The audience will sit at the back of the church or upstairs and are to stay sat together in their pairs. Pairs are asked to leave 1 metre space between them and the next pair.
- During the performance, all adult audience members will wear a face mask.
- No filming or photos to be taken.
- No food or drink should be brought into the church.
- No toilet facilities will be available for members of the audience.
- Doors will be kept open to allow for ventilation. Please wear warm clothes.

After:

- At the end of each performance, children to leave first, then audience.
- All audience members are asked to move away from the church area ready for the next class of children to enter for the next performance. Thank you.
- Once home, all adult audience members to complete a second LFD (as recommended by Somerset Public Health).
- For everyone's safety, including all adults, babies and pre-school children, staff and children at the school, all visitors to the church must agree to follow these requirements.
- After each performance, chairs and touch points will be cleaned with disinfectant wipes.
