Subjects

Maths




This term, we are really focussing on developing our knowledge and understanding of place value in numbers to 50 and beyond and up to 100, when children are ready. We identify what numbers are made of and how they compare with one another. For example: 27 is made up of 2 tens and 7 ones, it is one more than 26 and one less than 28, it is greater than 25, but less than 29. We could also investigate how many ways we could make 27 using other numbers, such as $20 + 7$, $10 + 10 + 7$, $30 - 3$ etc. We are then using this knowledge to explore addition and subtraction facts using these numbers. Counting in 2s, 5s and 10s is also a focus this term, introducing the concept of multiplication.

English

We are focussing on reading, sentence structure, spellings and handwriting throughout our English work this term. All children will continue to receive daily phonics lessons following the Read Write Inc scheme.

We have begun to read a new chapter book and *The Way Home for Wolf* is our class reading comprehension book this half term.

We are continuing to follow the Nelson Handwriting Scheme in school. Please encourage your child to practise letter formation, including 'being ready to write' (sitting on a chair, feet flat on the floor, chair pulled in, straight back and secure and controlled pencil grip), whenever they get the opportunity to write at home.

Science

In Science this term our focus on biology, will be investigating flowering plants, and the human body and senses. In chemistry we will build on our knowledge of exploring materials and their properties. In physics we will continue to explore the changes in our seasons, particularly looking closely at the plants and trees in our school grounds.

Geography and History

 In Geography we will find out about the United Kingdom and the countries within it. We will be learning more about maps and where we are located in England.

In our History work, we will be finding out about more significant, famous people and their impact on our lives. We will learn about Neil Armstrong  and Helen Sharman.

DT

In DT (after the Half term break) we will be developing our knowledge and understanding of sandwiches. We will be researching, planning, making and evaluating a product of our own.

Art

In Art we will be looking at repeating patterns, identifying those around us and then creating our own. We will then move onto creating a decorative pattern in clay to create a commemorative tile/coaster for the Queen's Jubilee.

Computing

In computing with Mr Goodman, we are going to be designing simple games.

PSHE

In PSHE we will begin by looking at 'Being my Best', focussing on healthy eating and persevering to learn new skills. We will then move on to Growing and Changing, where we will identify what babies need and how they need to be cared for, before thinking about our bodies now and identifying which parts are private and who we can talk to about them if we need to.

RE

In RE we will learn about Judaism and find out what Jews believe about God, creation, Moses and the ten commandments.

Reading

Just as in the previous terms, reading books will be sent home for you and your child to share.

Reading books are changed on Mondays and Thursdays. The expectation is that your child is heard read 5 times per week at home.

In addition to your child's reading book, they may also bring home a book they have been sharing and practising during Phonics. Please make time to allow your child to read this text back to you and let them 'be the teacher' so they can enjoy sharing what they have been learning in class!

A picture book will also be sent home for enjoyment and discussion.

Please sign and comment in your child's Reading Record when they have shared any of these books with you.

Spellings

Spelling bookmarks will be sent home in book bags. These are in line with your child's most recent assessment and give guidance as to which spellings to practise at home. Please continue to practise these regularly online and in handwriting books.

Maths

Your child will be bringing home a maths booklet. Details to follow soon, so please keep a look out.
